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THE ATLANTIC NEPTUNE

A COMPARISON of the copies of Des Barres' *The Atlantic Neptune*, in The New York Public Library, made in May, 1931, when, by gift of Mr. Arthur Curtiss James, a Trustee of the Library, a third copy was added to those from the Astor and Lenox collections, started an investigation, still incomplete, of "one of the most remarkable products of human industry that has ever been given to the world through the arts of printing and engraving."¹ At first glance it appeared that three copies, even of so important a work, were a surfeit, but closer examination revealed so many variations, both in plates and dates of issue, that the three, so far from duplicating, were seen actually to supplement each other.

Plates of *The Atlantic Neptune* appear to have been issued at various times from 1774 to 1784. Title-pages, which have given rise to attempts to establish "editions," were issued under dates of 1777, 1780, 1781, and 1784, but so far the only record found of bound volumes is that in the description in *L'Esprit des Journaux*, Paris, 1784. Of the known sets or volumes "no two copies of *The Atlantic Neptune* have been found containing exactly the same collection of plates and no complete list exists of the plates which were issued from time to time in connection with this most important publication which Rich in his *Bibliotheca Americana Nova* 1; 249,² refers to as 'the most splendid collection of charts, plates and views ever published.' *The Atlantic Neptune* exists bound in two forms: in folio, the full size of the plates, and in narrow folio with the plates folded vertically."³

The great number of variant printings — ten or more for some of the plates — and the confusion of dates, made the task of identification complicated and

difficult. What seemed to present a simple problem of checking became a fascinating hunt over faint and tortuous trails. In the table following this introduction will be found the results of minute examinations of the Library's plates and comparisons wherever possible with the plates in the Stevens collection.⁴

The feature of the James copy of *The Atlantic Neptune* which immediately distinguished it from the Astor and Lenox copies was the inclusion of a magnificent proof before letters of the "View of New York." Of this engraving, no more than twelve examples are known, and this James copy was the Library's second. The other being that in the Stokes collection, now on view in the Fifth Avenue corridor on the third floor of the Central Building.

In his *Iconography*, v. 1, p. 346-349, Mr. Stokes describes this view as follows:

"The view must have been drawn between 1763, when Des Barres first visited New York after his appointment as engineer in charge of the preparation of *The Atlantic Neptune*, and 1773, when the Governor's House (Mansion House) in the Fort, which appears in the view, was destroyed by fire, this house never having been rebuilt inside the Fort. Although it has not proved possible to assign a definite date between these limits, the general appearance of the view in comparison with the various maps of the period seems to indicate that it was drawn shortly before 1773.

"This view is generally considered one of the most attractive and interesting representations of New York in the eighteenth century. Although the height of the bluff on which Trinity Church stands has evidently been exaggerated (Broadway in front of the church is actually only about thirty-five feet above high water), the contour of the land is, nevertheless, probably more accurately depicted than on the Carwitham or any other early view of the city. This is natural, as we know that special pains to secure accuracy were taken in the preparation of the plates of *The Atlantic Neptune*, which were intended primarily for military purposes.

"The view shows very clearly the Fort and the buildings which it contained at this period. By a comparison with the Ratzen plan, it is easy to recognize the principal buildings throughout the entire city. The little settlement at the extreme left clusters around Paulus Hook Ferry, which is the slip just south of King's Wharf, the central of the three wharves seen in the view. The houses rising steeply

one above the other in line with the most southerly of these three wharves are on Crown (Liberty), Little Queen (Cedar), and Stone (Thames) Streets. The church at the summit of the bluff is of course Trinity, just south of which, across Rector Street, may be discerned the building of the Free English School. The small steeple south of Trinity is that of the Lutheran Church, on Broadway below Rector Street. Next to this is seen the Middle Dutch Church. The positive identification of the next tower and steeple presents some difficulties. They are probably intended to represent the Wall Street Presbyterian Church, which we know from Smith's *History of the Province of New York* (1757), p. 192, had a 'Steeple' 145 feet high. Kalm, too, writing in 1748-9, says the church had a 'steeple and a bell in it.' From views of the period, notably from the large view forming part of the Ratzer map, and from the manuscript view made after the fire of 1776, we know that the steeple of this church at this time was surmounted by a cupola, and not by a spire. Indeed, the only churches having pointed spires were Trinity Church, the old Lutheran Church on Broadway below Rector Street, and the South Dutch Church in Garden Street. The only other church having at this period a tall steeple or tower was St. George's Church on Beekman Street, and, from a glance at the Ratzen plan, it will be seen that from the point from which the view is taken it is not possible to bring this steeple into range with that of the Presbyterian Church, and, besides, the point of view is so low that the steeple of St. George's could not have appeared above the cupola of the Presbyterian Church. Furthermore, the steeple of St. George's differed materially from the representation in the view. The most likely explanation seems to be that the tower and cupola of the Wall Street Church, which we know were tall and attenuated, have been erroneously depicted in this view, which perhaps was elaborated from a hasty sketch.

"Next appear the tower and cupola of the French Church du St. Esprit in King (Pine) Street. Some little distance to the south the cupola and flag of the City Hall are clearly discernible, and south of this again we recognize the spire of the South Dutch Church in Garden Street. The large building in the Fort is the Mansion House referred to above; the low building in front of it, the stables. These buildings are very distinctly shown on the plan of the Fort drawn by Sauthier. The two houses between the stern of the ship and the north-west bastion of the Fort are apparently the same two which appear prominently in this location on the Bradford and Ratzer maps and in the Carwitham view. The northerly and larger of the two was occupied at this period by Christopher Blondel, store-keeper of the Fort, who received a lease of the lot on November 16, 1752, for ninety-nine years at 2s 6d. per year. This house occupies the same site on which 'Gen. Hunter was pleased to permit Thomas Elde the Armourer

of the Fort to erect a small tenement' about forty years earlier, as Christopher Blondel recites in his petition. He adds: 'the house is become ruinous and a sort of pest house for the sick of the city.' — Land Papers (Albany), XV: 25. See also *Chronology*, 1752, November 15. It is possible that our view shows this house enlarged, or, more probably, a new building altogether. In 1792, the house, which had come into the possession of Thomas Joseph Smith, was purchased for £750 by the City of New York, as it interfered with improvements then being made at the Battery.

"The small house just to the south seems to have stood on government property; it was apparently enlarged and converted into stores before 1788, when it appears so designated on the survey of the Fort in the office of the State Engineer at Albany. Both of these buildings are clearly seen on the smaller view from the Atlantic Neptune. A roof, probably that of the Secretary's Office, appears between and just above these two houses. The high roof slightly to the left and behind the more northerly of the two is probably that of the Kennedy House, No. 1 Broadway, built about 1760 by Archibald Kennedy on the site of two smaller houses facing Market-field Street. The house just north, at No. 3 Broadway, which belonged to Kennedy's father, was occupied in 1745 as the Custom House. The Custom House was moved to Whitehall in 1769 (*The New-York Gazette*; and the *Weekly Mercury*, May 8, 1769), but in 1776 seems to have been temporarily at least brought back to this locality, as it is shown on the Holland plan of that year (reproduced in *Valentine's Manual*, 1863, opp. p. 532) just west of No. 1 Broadway. However, as this plan also shows the Governor's House in the Fort, which house we know was destroyed by fire in 1773, its reliability appears somewhat questionable. For a further discussion concerning the location of the Custom House during this period, see *Chronology*, 1756, August 26.

"The line of posts between the Fort and the shore evidently marks the remains of the outer defences, so prominent a feature in the Carwitham view. These posts or pickets were still standing in 1784, when the Assembly requested the Governor to give orders that the poor be allowed to use them for fire-wood (*Assembly Journal*, February 13, 1784). The screens themselves had been demolished by Montresor on November 1, 1765, during the early days of the Stamp Act Riots, as they interfered with the raking fire of the flanking guns. — Montresor's *Journals in Collections N. Y. Hist. Society* (1881), p. 336.

"The battery forming the outer breastwork south of the south-west bastion of the Fort can be discerned at the extreme right of the view. . .

"The little pavilion with the pyramidal roof, which is seen on the shore in range with the Lutheran Church, can be recognized on the Ratzen plan. It was

built at the south-west angle of a walled garden seen in the view and owned at this time by the heirs of Sir Peter Warren and Oliver De Lancey. — Recitals in *Liber C of Grants*, in Comptroller's Office, pp. 302–8. (In the Warren papers in the New York Historical Society Library is a sketch of Sir Peter Warren's lots from Broadway to the farthest extent of the water grant, 77 ft. on Broadway, 81 ft. in the rear.) The garden was in the rear of numbers 59, 61, 63, and 65 Broadway. At this period the river shore was at Greenwich Street, so that the summer-house stood where the Adams Express Company building west of Trinity Place now is. The little building at the foot of the bluff below Trinity is also found on the Ratzen plan just to the south of a narrow lane, all that remains of the little street shown on the Maerschallck plan just below Trinity Church. It stood in the rear of the school-house plot on land belonging to the church."

The magnificent impression of this view in the James set was proof before letters, no imprint, no title, on paper bearing the watermark "J. B." (J. Bates). The Stokes plate, presented to the Library in 1930, is also on Bates paper.

Neither the exact number of plates which constitute a complete set of *The Atlantic Neptune*, nor the number of variants of many of the plates, can be determined exactly. The exhaustive search made by the late Henry Newton Stevens discovered 176 charts, views, and title-pages. The Library now owns 167. The plates were prepared and published in London from 1774 to 1784 under the direction of J. F. W. Des Barres, who made the original surveys for the coast of Nova Scotia in the years from 1763 to 1774.

Des Barres' "task was an arduous one involving great attention to details, selecting, correcting and adopting not only the surveys which had been made by himself in America, but those which were sent to London by other workers; and in addition he had to supervise the engraving, printing and publishing of the sheets. He was engaged in this enterprise for ten years, having in 1776–1779 a staff of twenty to twenty-three assistants, while in other years they never numbered more than seven. . .

"Des Barres published a partial catalogue of his 1781 edition, of which Harvard College Library has a copy. [Photostat copies of this catalogue are in the Library of Congress and The New York Public Library.] The publisher was W. Babbs . . . and [the catalogue] consists of fifteen pages and contains the titles and prices of the plates, a few being added in writing.

"On two pages is printed the following notice:

*For the conveniency of Navigators, and the public, any Chart or View comprehended in this work may be had singly of W. Babbs, Bookseller (No. 31) Oxford Street."*⁵

A description, of *The Atlantic Neptune* was published in *L'Esprit des Journaux*, Paris, 1784, and translated by Mr. Stokes in his *Iconography*, v. 1, p. 349, as follows:

"There has recently been placed on sale at The Hague by P. F. Gosse, court book-seller and printer, a superb Atlas, which we take this first opportunity to describe in detail. This work, which is indispensable for the navy, is the result of nineteen years' labor and has cost the English government more than £100,000 sterling, in addition to the considerable expense which the author himself has discharged for its execution. The work is of the highest degree of beauty and superior to everything of the kind that has heretofore been published.

"It is entitled: —

"Plans of the coast and harbours of North America, entitled: the Atlantic Neptune, executed, engraved and published by the order of the government for the use of the Royal Navy of Great Britain, by Joseph F. W. Des barres, Esq., under the direction of the very honorable Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty. . .

"The first part contains the original plans by the author, of the coast and the harbours of Nova Scotia with soundings, maritime remarks, etc. on LXXXIV leaves of royal paper. The second part consists of charts composed of different plans, observations and remarks of officers of the navy and army employed by the government as follows:

"The coast and the harbours of the gulf and river St. Lawrence and of the islands of Cape Breton, St. John, etc. on XXXVI leaves of royal paper.

"The charts of the harbours and the coast between New York and the entrance of the Mississippi river on XXVI leaves of royal paper.

"The price of this Atlas bound in one volume in calf is 160 florins, and as the work is sold for the account of the author it will be delivered only on receipt of cash. Address Pierre-Frédéric Gosse, Court bookseller and printer to S. A. S. who alone is authorized by the author to dispose of this work in foreign parts.

"The same Atlas (*impression supérieure*) large size on imperial paper with the addition of several pictures superbly printed in colours representing views of the coasts, the river banks and interior portion of the country, views of towns, remarkable places, etc. the whole accompanied by numerous interesting plans and views of military operations occurring during the war in America.

"In two Volumes.

"The price of this work complete in CCLVIII sheets on imperial paper is 252 florins, money of Holland, payable in cash."⁶

The Babbs catalogue, the Rich list, and the description quoted above remain the only published extensive sources of information about sets of *The Atlantic Neptune*. The most complete and authoritative study of the plates is, however, the list compiled by Mr. Stevens who brought together what is probably the finest collection of Atlantic Neptune plates and views in existence. It was not, however, until the summer of 1935 that Mr. Stevens' work, the result of a lifetime of research, was made available. Then, through the cooperation of the firm of Henry Stevens, Son & Stiles, and with the generous permission of the National Maritime Museum at Greenwich, England, which had recently acquired the collection, the Library was allowed to use Mr. Stevens' manuscript and to make two photostat copies, one for research use here and one for the Library of Congress.

The Stevens index is numbered in accordance with "The Henry Newton Stevens Collection of *The Atlantic Neptune*," in the Maritime Museum, in which each chart, view, or title-page is loose in a separate cloth folder. The 176 folders are enclosed in twenty half-morocco solander cases which are, in turn, enclosed in a mahogany case measuring about six by five feet. In each of the folders are all of the variant examples of one title, and the collection contains a total of 778 pieces. One of the most important contributions to the study of *The Atlantic Neptune* made by Mr. Stevens was his determination, by means of paper and watermarks, of priority of issue. A summary of his findings is given in the following letter from his firm:

"We think that we ought to mention that Mr. Stevens made a life-long study of this work and produced a very extensive bibliography. This exists only in his original manuscript and typewritten transcript, both of which are housed in the cabinet with the Collection. Mr. Stevens in his study of the subject, definitely proved that the editions of the Neptune were printed on papers as follows, and that although there may not be any actual cartographical differences the type of paper definitely fixed the priority of issue. The papers are [in order of use]:

Paper with watermark 'L. V. G.'

Paper with no watermark.

Paper with Bates watermark — 'J. Bates' or 'J. B.'

Paper with mixed Bates-Whatman watermark.

Paper with Whatman watermark.

Wove paper with no watermark.

Odd charts here and there are found on papers with mixed Bates-L. V. G. watermarks, and a watermark E. Occasionally very late issues have been discovered on L. V. G. paper, but the cartographical differences or date of imprint

have definitely placed these as late issues, and the inference is that they were pulled on a sheet of L. V. G. paper which happened to be on hand.”⁷

After each item in the index of the Library's collection, which follows, the type of paper upon which the plates were printed is indicated. The imprint, plate mark, and lettering are also given, and notes to aid not only in identifying the plate or chart, but to show possible differences between copies and imprints have been added. The titles as shown are in most cases arbitrary ones because the plates as a rule are without letterpress or actual titles. Selection of titles has been governed by the Stevens index, and the attempt made to assign to plates and charts the Stevens titles — except in certain instances where more descriptive titles have been given to help in identifying the plate. The lack of letterpress or titles on charts and plates in a collection of *The Atlantic Neptune* makes it very difficult to describe or identify them. It is all the more difficult when cartographical differences are found on plates with the same imprint date, or different imprint dates are engraved on plates with no apparent cartographical differences. A further complication is added by the several papers used. A glance at the index of The New York Public Library's three sets together with the additional Atlantic Neptune views from the Phelps Stokes collection, should show the improbability of finding two identical sets of *The Atlantic Neptune*.

The same considerations affect the so-called *editions*, often referred to as being issued in 1777, 1780, 1781, and 1784, some in folio the full size of the plates, others in narrow folio — the plates being folded vertically. The use of “edition” to describe a set seems improper and a more correct description of any set of *The Atlantic Neptune* would be “a collection of maps, plates, and charts bearing imprint dates from 17— to 17— with title-pages as follows: Vol. I, 17—, Vol. II, 17—,” etc.

After the plates were printed, they were, presumably, put aside. In 1777 a title-page was printed but the collection of prints brought together by any purchaser may have contained 1774 plates, 1776 plates, etc. Such a collection should not, therefore, be called an “edition of 1777” nor should a volume bearing the date 1780, 1781, or 1784, be called an *edition* of that date. For example, the magnificent Arthur Curtiss James copy, has, until now, been referred to as the “1780 edition.” Why should this be called a 1780 edition when it has imprint dates from 1776 to 1781? True, the general title-page to Volume 1 is dated 1780, but there is no general title-page to Volume 2 and the engraved title to the New England section is dated 1781. Even if a collection could be brought together of plates, views, and charts, all bearing imprint date 1777, and engraved title-

pages dated 1777, an examination of individual plates, paper, and watermarks would without a doubt disclose that any number of the plates were printed after 1777, but with the imprint line unchanged. This would probably be true of any one of the so-called editions of 1777, 1780, 1781, or 1784.

The Library's copies are presumably combinations of collections brought together for some reason or other, and should not be dated and called "editions," but called "collections of plates without imprint," or "with imprints of certain dates bearing title-pages and other certain dates." In the following index, No. 1 is the copy originally in the Astor Library, No. 2 that from the Lenox Library, No. 3 the gift of Mr. Arthur Curtiss James, No. 4 views from *The Atlantic Neptune* presented to The New York Public Library in 1930. These views, eight in number, form part of the Stokes Collection of American historical views, prints, and engravings presented at that time by Mr. Stokes in memory of Anson Phelps Stokes and Helen L. Phelps Stokes, and now on permanent exhibition on the walls of the third floor corridors of the Central Building.

The James copy is in two elephant folio volumes bound in full blue levant morocco, and the plates are remarkably well-preserved. The Lenox copy was one of the narrow folio copies, the plates having been folded vertically before binding; the Astor copy is, like the James, in the full folio size. A few years ago the Astor and Lenox copies were removed from their disintegrated calf bindings, which could no longer be preserved or saved, and the plates were put into full-size folio blue buckram portfolios. The plates of these two copies are now, of course, loose, and can be handled individually. The Library now has 167 different plates and a total of 467 issues of which 122 are variations and 345⁸ are duplicate impressions, of *The Atlantic Neptune*. The Stevens Collection at the National Maritime Museum contains 176, of which two are in manuscript and therefore unique, with a total of 778 variations.⁹ Mr. Lawrence Martin, Chief of the Division of Maps, Library of Congress, reports that the Library of Congress possesses "nineteen complete or incomplete copies of *The Atlantic Neptune*, comprising more than 1369 plates as well as some scores of separate sheets."

Joseph F. W. Des Barres (1722–1824) was a military engineer, trained in the Royal Military College at Woolwich. He came to America as a lieutenant in 1756 and took a prominent part in the Canadian campaigns. "From 1763 to 1773 he was engaged in surveying the coast of Nova Scotia . . . Two years . . . were spent on the survey of the Isle of Sable alone. Two bars here, over which the surf broke often mast high, for seven leagues were strewn with wrecks, and could not be approached without the greatest risk. Des Barres completed the survey of the island and the soundings around it at the hazard of his life."¹⁰ He was in England, supervising publication of *The Atlantic Neptune*, until 1784 when he was appointed Lieutenant-Governor of Cape Breton. In 1805 he became Governor of Prince Edward Island, holding the post until 1813. Thereafter he lived in Halifax, Nova Scotia, until his death at the age of 102, in 1824.

"Apart from the practical value of *The Atlantic Neptune*, the artistic excellence of the views alone would give it high rank. This feature is solely due to Des Barres. He drew with great sensitiveness and had an exquisite sense of color. Many of his aquatints, whether in monotone or colors, are of the highest quality.

"We may wonder why so many views, both large and small, were made and the criticism that many of them had little practical value is just. But, this may be forgotten, when we consider their esthetic value, and we should be thankful that the first important efforts in cartography on the coasts of Canada and the United States should have been presented to the world with such delightful artistic accompaniments.

"The practical value of *The Atlantic Neptune* was soon demonstrated. It became the standard guide for ships of all nations in American waters. Yet the charts were in many instances defective, especially in regard to soundings. This is not surprising considering the extent of area covered. These defects gradually became known during the nineteenth century and fresh surveys had to be made by trained officers with competent staffs, with more means and better equipment and organization than Des Barres, Holland and other pioneers of the eighteenth century enjoyed."¹¹

PLATES OF *THE ATLANTIC NEPTUNE* IN THE NEW YORK
