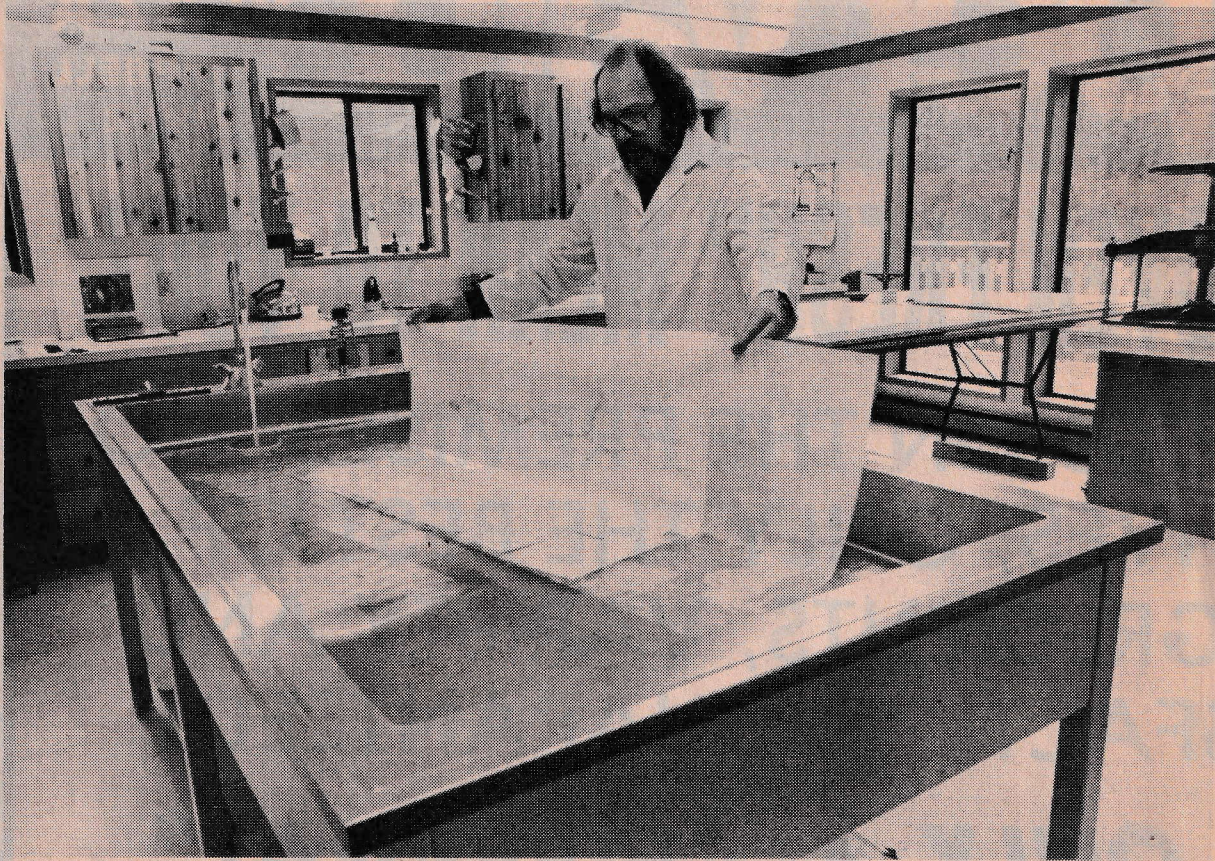

## Learn how to preserve your paper treasures

Almost everyone has a paper treasure – a packet of faded love letters, an album of photographs, an old book.

Few of us know how to care for them properly. The good news is that now we can learn what to do.

On Feb. 13, Father Charles A.E. Brandt, conservation consultant, presents *Preserving Paper Treasures* as the second program in the Campbell River Museum's Spring Events Series.

Father Brandt, who is known locally for his rec-

ommendations for the care and preservation of the Roderick Haig-Brown library, will present slides, demonstration, and commentary on how to care simply and practically for old books, prints, photographs, maps, letters and works of art on paper.

In the discussion following his presentation, he looks forward to answering specific questions from the audience.

This program will be presented at 7:30 p.m. in the CARIHI music room.

Admission is by donation or museum membership.

The program will be followed by two one-day workshops under the direction of Father Brandt at the Brandt Conservation Centre in Black Creek on March 23 and March 30.
