Dear Father Brandt:

Thank you for your letter of April 24, 1985, regarding the abandoned Mt. Washington Copper Mine. I share your concern that effluent from this mine may be affecting fish stocks in the Tsolum River. I have asked my staff to co-operate with the Ministry of Environment to fully assess the magnitude of the problem and, if required, to develop an appropriate strategy for controlling the problem.

It is not the current policy of this government to allow a mining company to abandon a property without first completing a reclamation program. Mt. Washington Copper, however, operated prior to the enactment of mine reclamation legislation in 1969 and was, therefore, not required to undertake a reclamation program.

I am hopeful that staff of my Ministry, together with those of the Ministry of Environment, will be able to find an appropriate solution to this problem.
