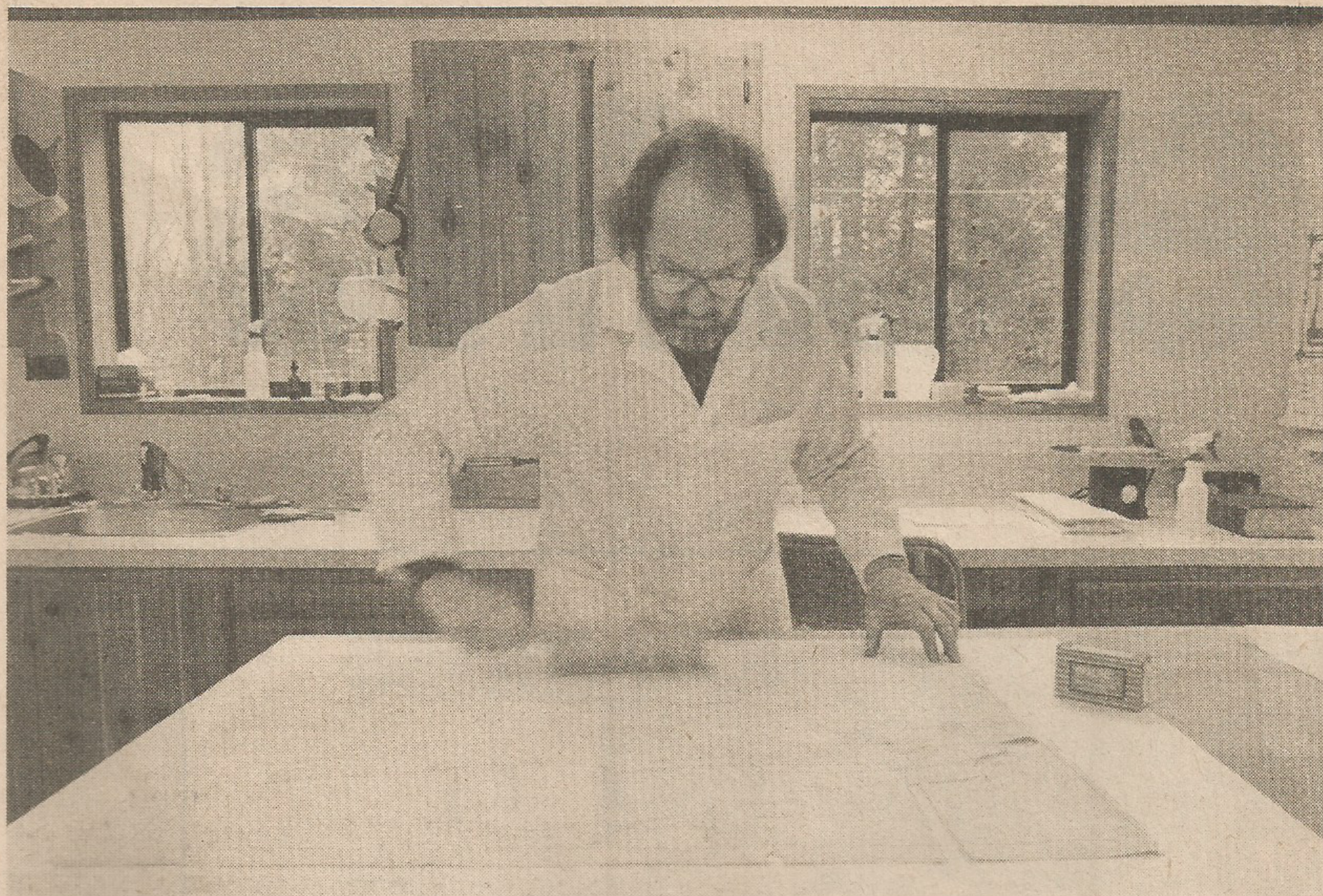

Saving paper treasures needs special technique

Almost everyone has a paper treasure – a packet of faded love letters, an album of photographs, an old book. Few of us know how to care for them properly. The good news is that now we can learn what to do.

On Feb. 13, Fr. Charles A.E. Brandt, conservation consultant, presents

Preserving Paper Treasures as the second programme in the Campbell River Museum sponsored Spring Events Series.

Brandt, who is known locally for his recommendations for the care and preservation of the Roderick Haig-Brown library, will present slides,

demonstration, and commentary on how to care simply and practically for old books, prints, photographs, maps, letters and works of art on paper. In the discussion following his presentation, he looks forward to answering specific questions from the audience.
